= 45 tens + 6 ones

(A) 4 sevens: This is like having 4 groups of 7.
 $7 + 7 + 7 + 7 = 28$

(B) $7 \times 7 \times 7 \times 7$: This means multiplying 7 by itself 4 times. That's a really big number, much bigger than 28.

(C) $4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4 + 4$: This is like adding 4 together 12 times, just like $7 \times 4 = 28$. So, it equals 28.

(D) 7 groups of 4 : This is the same as 7×4 , which is 28.

So, the one that doesn't have the same value as $7 \times 47 \times 4$ is $7 \times 7 \times 7 \times 7 \times 7 \times 7 \times 7$.


