Explanations and answers to select questions

- 01 Option (D) is the incorrect one. 'Acquaint' is the correct spelling.
- 20 Option (C) is the correct answer. Whenever the last syllable of a singular noun begins and ends with 's' as in "Moses", only the apostrophe is added after the last s of that noun. But if that is not the case, as in "Suhas", then we add the apostrophe and s, both.
- 21 Option (B) is the correct answer. To differ 'with' someone, on something.
- 23 Option (A) is the correct answer. When using 'neither' 'nor', the subject closer to the verb, determines the number of the verb. So here, 'he' determines the verb to be singular and hence 'was'.
- 25 Option (B) is the correct answer. The phrase 'as well as' seems to join the subjects 'Rani' and 'children', but it does not do so as it does not work as a conjunction, and so the verb agrees with the subject first mentioned, 'Rani'.
- 28 Option (C) is the correct answer. All are uncountable (material) nouns, but 'iron' can be a countable noun as an instrument.
- 30 Option (B) is the correct answer. 'Fuzzy' means lacking in 'Clarity', and 'Rigid' means lacking in 'flexibility'.
- 33 Option (B) is the correct answer. The reporting verb 'says' is in present tense and hence no change in the tense of the reported speech.
41. Option (C) is the correct answer. 'Awe-inspiring' is the best and only adjective/word to describe that story aptly, as it means, 'impressive; making you feel respect and admiration'.
