**Explanations and answers to select questions**

- 01 The words are : (i) Cobra [S], (ii) Burger [R], (iii) Rabbit [P], (iv) Brinjal [Q]. So, option (D) is the correct answer.
- 02 The words are : (i) Screw [S], (ii) Award [R], (iii) Flower [Q], (iv) Bowls [P]. So, option (C) is the correct answer.
- 09 Option (D) is the correct answer. It has a plural : curries.
- 11 Option (B) is the correct answer. The same spelling is its plural.
- 13 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'Bear' is pronounced as 'bare', not 'beer'.
- 14 Option (B) is the correct answer. Its masculine is 'gander'. Options (A) and D) are of common gender.
- 17 Option (B) is the correct answer. The first syllable of 'hard-working' produces a consonant sound as in 'harp', so 'a'. The first syllable of 'honest' produces a vowel sound as in 'office', so 'an'.
- 24 Option (B) is the correct answer. That's the one which is not kept as a pet. All others are.
- 29 Option (D) is the correct answer. When the gender of a creature/an animal can't be known by its name or when it is the name of its species covering both masculine and feminine genders, it is called 'common gender'.
- 34 Option (C) is the correct answer. The debate offered is between 'right' and 'wrong' and not between 'right' and 'left', although the policeman has that on his mind. Moreover as this exam was conducted in India, the conversation relates to Indian traffic police and their related rules. Have you appeared for this exam from a centre outside India ? If no, then your statement carries no point.
- 35 Option (D) is the correct answer. No. If the option (A) is true, you would find that sign even outside the shops where wheelchairs are sold and/or repaired. It is not a 'sale' sign. It is used for indicating 'parking' or 'reserved' areas in addition to 'availability of facilities' for the differently-abled, not only 'chairs' available for the differently-abled.
