## Explanations and answers to select questions

- 01 The words are : (i) Grapes [R], (ii) Igloo [P], (iii) Burglar [S], (iv) Pigeon [Q]. So, option (C) is the correct answer.
- 02 The words are : (i) Dolphin [R], (ii) Clown [S], (iii) Bulbs [P], (iv) Lizard [Q]. So, option (D) is the correct answer.
- 03 Option (B) is the correct answer. 'Hovercraft' has the same spelling for singular and plural. 'Fleet' is a 'collective noun'. All collective nouns such as 'fleet' here, are singulars and they do have plural spellings, like, 'fleets', 'herds', 'classes', 'flocks', 'crowds', etc.
- 04 Option (C) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is 'Umpire'.
- 05 Option (B) is the correct answer. The chicks cheep and their adults cluck.
- 07 Option (D) is the correct answer. Its masculine is 'gander'. All other options are of common gender.
- 09 Option (D) is the correct answer. A 'Crowd' of people.
- 12 Option (D) is the correct answer. It is the only form of tense (simple past) that agrees with the subject 'Ria'. Option (A) is an incorrect spelling of past tense of 'slide'.
- 15 Option (C) is the correct answer. The first syllable of 'unique' produces a consonant sound as in 'you', so 'a', and that of 'unused' produces a vowel sound as in 'amount', so 'an'.
- 21 Option (C) is the correct answer. The first pair is of antonyms and only 'Near' makes the second pair similar.
- 22 Option (D) is the correct answer. It is the only one with salty water.
- 28 Option (D) is the correct answer. When it is 'the elderly', it is a plural noun meaning 'the people who are old', similar use is, 'the poor'. However, when 'elderly' appears before a noun it is an adjective then.
- 29 Option (B) is the correct answer. The five activities are : skiing, snowboarding, building snowmen, ice skating on frozen ponds and taking peaceful walks in the snow-covered woods.
