Explanations and answers to select questions

- 02 Option (C) is the correct answer. Its homophone is 'Divers'.
- 08 Option (B) is the correct answer. Flurry = Flutter+Hurry.
- 09 Option (C) is the correct answer. The five other words are: least, slate, steal, tales, teals.
- 10 Option (D) is the correct answer. It's a noun/name used for a species and it doesn't specify a gender. That's a noun with common gender.
- 11 Option (B) is the correct answer. The adjectives are : 'His' and 'outstanding'. Possesive adjectives in English (his) refer to the possessor and not to the thing possessed.
- 12 Option (C) is the correct answer. They are : Se-vere.
- 21 Option (B) is the correct answer. Only 'judicious' provides an agreeing collocation to 'kind'.
- 23 Option (D) is the correct answer. The pronunciation of 'm' is as in 'aim', a vowel sound, so 'an'; the pronunciation of 'u' is as in 'you', a consonant sound, so 'a'; and pronunciation of the first syllable of 'manual' is as in 'man', a consonant sound, so 'a'.
- 25 Option (D) is the correct answer. The action (of standing) started before an hour and is continuing till the time of speaking (take) present tense, so present perfect continuous.
- 27 Option (D) is the correct answer. The phrase 'together with' is not a conjunction and neither does it work as one. That leaves the verb, only a singular subject (bride) to agree with.
- 30 Option (B) is the correct answer. In order to make transition to indirect speech, we need to use a past tense and that is not possible with 'must give'. Hence, we need to use its equivalent 'had to'.
- 32 Option (C) is the correct answer. Only that is a homophone.
