Explanations and answers to select questions

- 02 Option (C) is the correct answer. Its homophone is 'Navel'.
- 03 Option (B) is the correct answer. The 3 additional words are : aspired, diapers, praised.
- 04 Option (D) is the correct answer. It is the same spelling for singular.
- 05 Option (C) is the correct answer. A pack of cards, wolves, etc.
- 07 Option (B) is the correct answer. That correct spelling is : Chassis.
- 08 Option (C) is the correct answer. The 2 adverbs are : enough and fast.
- 10 Option (B) is the correct answer. They are : 'El-e-va-tor'.
- 21 Option (B) is the correct answer. Article 'the' because a 'particular movie', the one which the speaker saw, and 'an', because the first syllable of 'MGM' produces a vowel sound as in 'aim'.
- 24 Option (B) : 'rake' is the only correct answer. The correct known and established simile is 'As thin as a rake', not 'As thin as a stick'.
- 29 Option (C) is the correct answer. Option (A) can't be, because the sentence doesn't end with a question mark, although the arrangement of the verb and subject is inverse.
- 34 Option (B) is the correct answer. The sentence with corrections in brackets is : I look so tired b'cause ('cause or because) I had (have — see 'look', present tense) been working hole (whole) night.
- 39 Answer (C) is the only correct answer. If you carefully read the last paragraph, 'Overall, bicycle wheels are carefully designed . . . allowing riders to pedal smoothly and travel long distances with ease'; you will find the reason for and answer to : 'Why are bicycle wheels carefully designed ?' The question asks 'why' and not 'how', 'how well' or 'in what manner', bicycle wheels are designed.
