Explanations and answers to select questions

- 02 Option (D) is the correct answer. The four adjectives are : my, daily, roasted and chilled. Possessive adjectives in English (my) refer to the possessor and not to the thing possessed.
- 03 Option (C) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is : 'Humorous'.
- 04 Option (B) is the correct answer. It is the same spelling for singular and plural.
- 05 Option (A) is the correct answer. Its homophone is : 'Steel'.
- 06 Option (B) is the correct answer. The four syllables are : 'In-tel-li-gence'.
- 07 Option (D) is the correct answer. The seven 4-lettered words are : Earl, Earn, Elan, Lane, Near and Real.
- 10 Option (D) is the correct answer. They are : Masculine, Feminine, Neuter and Common.
- 13 Option (A) is the correct answer. Its past tense is not formed by adding 'ed' at its end.
- 23 Option (C) is the correct answer. The action of 'leaving' takes place before the action of 'reaching', which is expressed in simple past. Hence, past perfect for this action.
- 24 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'the blind' is a name in plural, meaning, 'the people who are blind', and so takes a plural verb for that active voice.
- 27 Option (C) is the correct answer. For the first blank 'the' because a specific aeroplane, the one for return journey; for the other two 'a', as the first syllables of those words produce a consonant sound as in 'you'.
- 29 Option (B) is the correct answer. The four commas required are at as : Manoj, his wife and their two children, like swimming, running, cycling and kite flying.
- 30 Option (D) is the correct answer. A tool used by a surgeon and that by a carpenter.
- 31 Option (B) is the correct answer. It is the only one that takes 'an' as its article.
- 32 Option (C) is the correct answer. Because the action is 'a thought in process of completion', not a completed action as expressed in option (A).
- 33 Option (D) is the correct answer. See 'went' changed to 'gone'.
- 38 Option (C) is the correct answer. The two homonyms are : 'chest' and 'just'.
