Explanations and answers to select questions

- 01 Option (C) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is : Forty.
- 04 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'Rank' is the correct answer and 'Rank and File' is a well-known word pair. And if 'the' is added before it, it becomes a noun. Please refer to the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020. A note stating the same is already printed in our communication as regards the exam.
- 06 Option (B) is the correct answer. 'Fiat' is an official order given by somebody in authority.
- 07 Option (A) is the correct answer. Its homophone is 'buoy'.
- 08 Option (B) is the correct answer. You may let us know of any authentic/certified source which proves it otherwise.
- 09 Option (D) is the only correct answer. There is no option given as (A) 'testing', which you quote.
- 12 The three adjectives are : his, undivided and detiled. Possesive adjectives in English (his) refer to the possessor and not to the thing possessed. Option (C) is the only correct answer. As stated in explanation printed just after the key, it is correct because possesive adjectives in English (his) refers to the possessor and not to the thing possessed. Sources like 'wikipedia' you mention, are 'informative' in nature, contain gathered information which may not be necessarily authentic and so are open to corrections. You may refer to some authentic book on English grammar like the one authored by J. C. Nesfield.
- 18 Option (C) is the only correct answer. The sentence talks about the act of 'preserving wildlife' which first needs 'inspiring' people to take action like educating about the 'how' of that.
- 19 Option (B) is the correct answer. The first syllables of 'FD' and 'emergen-cy' produce vowel sounds as in 'efficient' and 'ether' respectively, so we use 'an' for those blanks. There can't be any article before the determin-er 'every'.
- 22 Option (B) is the correct answer. When 'Neither'... 'nor' is used, the subject closer to the verb determines the number of the verb. Here 'parents' a plural, decides that, so, 'are'.
- 25 Option (B) is the correct answer. The reporting verb (says) being in present tense, there is no change of tense in the reported speech without quotes.
- 26 Option (D) is the only correct answer. Option (C) cannot be the answer as it talks about the use and benefits of the 'tree' as such; like its branches, leaves, wood etc., which are not covered in the story.
- 30 Option (D) is the only correct answer. You may refer to the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020. A note stating the same is already printed in our communication as regards the exam.
