**Explanations and answers to select questions**

03 Option (B) is the correct answer. All other options are past tenses. Please refer to the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020. A note stating the same is already printed in our communication as regards the exam.

04 Option (C) is the correct answer. The three other words are : pale, peal and plea.

06 Option (B) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is 'Harass'.

07 Option (D) is the correct answer. It is the same spelling for its plural. You may refer to the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020. A note stating the same is already printed in our communication as regards the exam.

08 Option (B) is the correct answer. You may let us know of any authentic/certified source which proves it otherwise.

12 Option (D) is the correct answer. Its homophone is 'Mettle'.

13 Option (B) is the correct answer. 'Meme' is pronounced as 'meem'.

16 Option (B) is the correct answer. Option (D) cannot be the right answer, because its first letter 'R', is in capital, which won't let it fit in there.

23 Option (C) is the correct answer. 'Police' is an all-time plural noun.

26 Option (D) is the only correct answer. You may refer to the Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020. A note stating the same is already printed in our communication as regards the exam.

28 Option (C) is the correct answer. The first syllables of 'SUV' and 'auto-rickshaw' produce vowel sounds as in 'ace' and 'outing' respectively, so 'an', and the first syllable of 'one-way' produces a consonant sound as in 'won', so 'a'.

29 Option (D) is the correct answer. There is no change in the tense of the reported speech without quotes, because the statement is a universal truth.

30 Option (C) is the correct answer. There is no change in the tense of the reported speech without quotes, because the reporting verb (*says*) is in the simple present.

31 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'The first two given words are related to each other in the same way (behavioural reaction towards the other) as the third word and option 'D' : 'Stranger' are, and so 'Stranger' forms a pair with the 3rd word in a similar manner, correctly.

33 Option (D) is the correct answer. Change to passive form is not possible in past perfect continuous tense, which the given sentence uses.

50 Option (B) is the only correct answer. Hyperbole is a way of speaking or writing about something by exaggerating either way (enlargement or reduction or contrasts of the like), than it really is.
