Explanations and answers to select questions

- 01 Option (C) is the correct answer. Option (A) cannot be the correct answer as the question asks : which is an 'irreversible word pair'. The other similar word pair in common use is 'Pay and Park', not 'Park and Pay' which the use of option (A) will result into.
- 03 Option (C) is the correct answer. Slithy = Slimy+Lithe.
- 05 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'Tunny' is the plural of 'Tuna'.
- 06 The 3 words are : parroted, prorated, teardrop. Option (D) is the correct answer. The 3 words are : parroted, prorated, teardrop. These are the only three possible correct English words as per Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020. A note stating the same as : The question paper and its key lie within the purview of Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020 is clearly printed in our communication about/exam papers.
- 07 Option (D) is the correct answer and the syllables given there (Reg-is-tra-tion) are correct as per our source which is authentic. Any non-agreement to that can be made known to us with authentic/certified source which proves it that way.
- 11 Option (C) is the correct answer. Its homophone is 'wrap'.
- 13 Option (D) is the only correct answer. The correct spelling is : 'Raspberry'. All other options are incorrectly spelt.
- 14 It has no verb, 'spat' is a noun there, hence it cannot be a clause or a sentence and it is not an idiom either. Option (C) is the only correct answer. Option (B) 'spat' is not past tense of a verb, but is a noun here and so that is not a sentence, but is a 'phrase'. One may refer Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020 for the same.
- 21 Option (D) is the correct answer. The antecedent for the verb is 'that', the quantity of water.
- 25 Option (B) is the only correct answer. The phrase 'as well as' seems to join the subjects in a sentence (Karan and Tarun here), but it does not work as a conjunction like 'and'; so the verb agrees only with the subject first mentioned (Karan) here.
- 27 Option (D) is the correct answer. Both 'heir' and 'FD', single-syllabled words, produce a vowel sound as in 'air' and 'effort' respectively, so 'an' for both.
- 28 Option (B) is the only correct answer. You may refer to Oxford Advanced Learner's Dictionary, 10th edition published in 2020 as printed in our communication about/exam papers.
- 29 Option (C) is the correct answer. It is the only one that is a singular noun.
- 31 Option (C) is the correct answer. As the reporting verb (*will say*) is in the simple future tense, there is no change of tense in the reported speech without quotes.
- 33 Option (C) is the correct answer. The first two are opposites of each other and so are 'Indifference' and 'Heed'.
- 35 A sentence in future continuous tense cannot be changed to passive voice. Option (C) is the only correct answer. Those who claim it otherwise, may write to us their version separately, proving it within the framework of English grammar.
- 40 Option (C) is the correct answer. The three homonyms are : 'over', 'bank' and 'close'.
- 44 Option (B) is the correct answer. The four stages are : earliest (hunting and gathering), pastoral, agricultural and handicraft.
