Explanations and answers to select questions

- 03 Option (C) is the correct answer. Its singular is 'femur'.
- 06 Option (D) is the correct answer. Its correct spelling is 'uncertainty'.
- 07 Option (B) is the correct answer. It also means a box containing cutlery or a small container for carrying water or similar liquid.
- 10 Option (C) is the correct answer. The five other words are : drapes, padres, parsed, rasped and spared.
- 16 Option (C) is the correct answer. The five syllables are : Un-con-di-tion-al.
- 22 Option (A) is the correct answer. Options (B) and (C) cannot be used because of the presence of article 'a' before the blank.
- 25 Option (C) is the correct answer. Here, it is not a field of study, but are sales figures, a plural.
- 27 Option (D) is the correct answer. The given sentence is a second conditional with its pattern : 'If + past simple (took), would + infinitive (be)', with 'not' added for the required effect. The placement of the 'if clause' and the 'main clause' has been interchanged though.
- 28 Option (B) is the correct answer. The first syllables of the words 'HTML' and 'unusal' produce vowel sounds as in 'etch' and 'undue' respectively, so 'an'. The first syllables of the words 'one-week' and 'university' produce a consonant sound as in 'won' and 'you', so 'a'.
- 29 Option (C) is the correct answer. Only that can be a noun too.
- 31 Option (B) is the correct answer. The sentence with (corrections) : He was fine (fined) because he fell (felled) down a tree.
- 32 Option (D) is the correct answer. There is no change of tense in the reported speech without quotes because that's a universal truth.
- 33 Option (C) is the correct answer. There is no change of tense in the reported speech without quotes because the reporting verb (says) is in present tense.
- 35 Option (C) is the correct answer. It is not possible to have a passive voice construction in past perfect continuous tense, which the sentence uses.
