Explanations and answers to select questions

- 01 Option (C) is the correct answer. All others are of common gender.
- 02 Option (B) is the correct answer. For others, the homophones are 'damn', 'see' and 'waive'.
- 05 Option (C) is the correct answer. It is: Boom+Hoist.
- 06 Option (D) is the correct answer. It can be the comparative degree of adjective 'strange'.
- 10 Option (B) is the correct answer. The correct spelling is : Astronaut.
- 12 Option (D) is the correct answer. The 4 other words are : emits, mites, smite and times.
- 22 Option (C) is the correct answer. The verb at the blank refers to (antecedent) 'the maximum length of time', a singular, hence a singular verb, and keeping up with the sequence of time as in the following sentence, we need to use 'is'.
- 24 Option (C) is the correct answer. As 'HP' produces a vowel sound as in 'Etch P', 'An' before it, and 'pilgrims' being plural, 'no article'. As 'one-sided' produces a consonant sound as in 'won', 'a' before it.
- 26 Option (B) is the correct answer. The phrase 'together with' is not a conjuncion, so it doesn't combine the subjects 'Lily' and 'Tina'. So only 'Lily', a singular subject needs to agree with the verb.
- 27 Option (D) is the correct answer. 'As sick as a parrot' means 'very disappointd'.
- 30 Option (D) is the correct answer to fill the blank correctly, contextually. The idiom 'A penny for your thoughts' is used to ask somebody what they are thinking about.
- 31 Option (C) is the correct answer. Only that comes single, all others come in pairs.
